# **PHILANTHROPIC**

Lifesaver Special Project: The "Lifesaver" program is designed to help families with person's who wander away due to cognitive or other issues. A special unit is placed on the person with a transmitter which is monitored by local Sheriff and Police departments. If a person wanders away they can be located quickly and returned home safely. The units are about \$300 each, but are provided at no cost. However, the monitoring is \$30 a month. At the September stated meeting the members voted to have Sister Gloria contact the Rockingham County Sheriff's office about the possibility of the chapter sponsoring a family in need and covering the monthly monitoring cost.

<u>Valley Open Doors</u> – in September the members voted to collect requested items for Valley Open Doors. Men's and Women's underwear, undershirts, hats, gloves and full size toiletries.
